The following litter pick will meet at 2 pm on Sunday 2 June 2024 by (former) No. 44 Furniture Shop on the corner of Portsmouth Road and Between Streets. Hi viz jackets, litter pickers and litterbags will be provided, but please wear appropriate clothes and gloves.

Over the last two years, Elmbridge BC has installed over 500 bins in our green spaces and high streets and increased the frequency of litter and fly-tip patrols. Elmbridge BC has also started the 'Keep Elmbridge Tidy' campaign in spring 2023 with on-site posters, banners and messages on social media channels and newsletters. This year, it is stepping up its anti-litter campaign with competitions amongst other things to engage the public.
